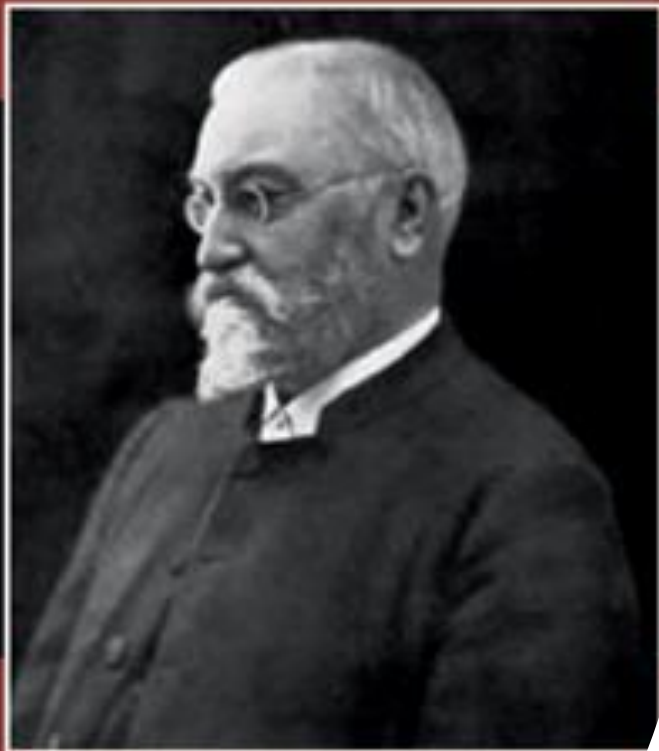

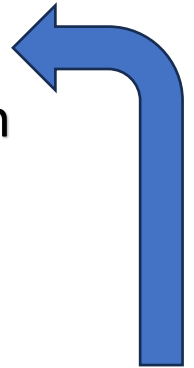

KJV Proverbs 25:1 These are also proverbs of Solomon, which the men of Hezekiah king of Judah copied out.

2 It is the glory of God to conceal a thing: but the honour of kings is to search out a matter.

3 The heaven for height, and the earth for depth, and the heart of kings is unsearchable.1

4 Take away the dross from the silver, and there shall come forth a vessel for the finer.

5 Take away the wicked from before the king, and his throne shall be established in righteousness.

6 Put not forth thyself in the presence of the king, and stand not in the place of great men:1 (Prov. 25:1-6 KJV)

The fool: Prov. 26:1, 4-6, 8, 10-12

KJV Proverbs 26:1 As snow in summer, and as rain in harvest, so honour is not seemly for a fool.

2 As the bird by wandering, as the swallow by flying, so the curse causeless shall not come.

3 A whip for the horse, a bridle for the ass, and a rod for the fool's back.

4 Answer not a fool according to his folly, lest thou also be like unto him.

5 Answer a fool according to his folly, lest he be wise in his own conceit.¹

6 He that sendeth a message by the hand of a fool cutteth off the feet, and drinketh damage.¹

7 The legs of the lame are not equal: so is a parable in the mouth of fools.¹

8 As he that bindeth a stone in a sling, so is he that giveth honour to a fool.¹

9 As a thorn goeth up into the hand of a drunkard, so is a parable in the mouth of fools.

10 The great God that formed all things both rewardeth the fool, and rewardeth transgressors.¹

11 As a dog returneth to his vomit, so a fool returneth to his folly.¹

12 Seest thou a man wise in his own conceit? there is more hope of a fool than of him.
