The fool: Prov. 26:1, 4-6, 8, 10-12

KJV Proverbs 26:1 As snow in summer, and as rain in harvest, so honour is not seemly for a fool.

2 As the bird by wandering, as the swallow by flying, so the curse causeless shall not come.

3 A whip for the horse, a bridle for the ass, and a rod for the fool's back.

4 Answer not a fool according to his folly, lest thou also be like unto him.

5 Answer a fool according to his folly, lest he be wise in his own conceit.1

6 He that sendeth a message by the hand of a fool cutteth off the feet, and drinketh damage.1

7 The legs of the lame are not equal: so is a parable in the mouth of fools.1

8 As he that bindeth a stone in a sling, so is he that giveth honour to a fool.1

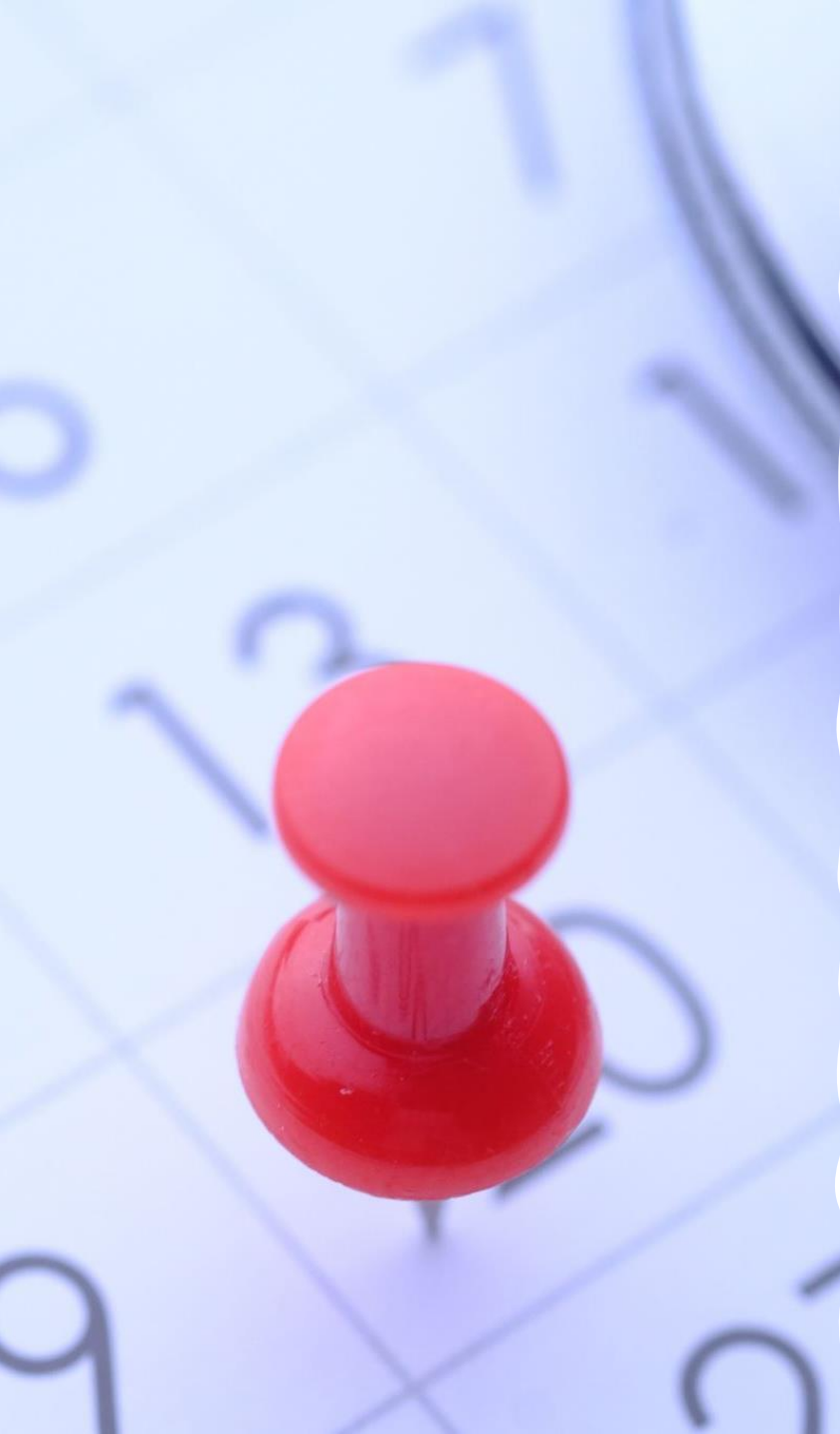
9 As a thorn goeth up into the hand of a drunkard, so is a parable in the mouth of fools.

10 The great God that formed all things both rewardeth the fool, and rewardeth transgressors.1

11 As a dog returneth to his vomit, so a fool returneth to his folly.1

12 Seest thou a man wise in his own conceit? there is more hope of a fool than of him.

(Prov. 26:1-12 KJV)



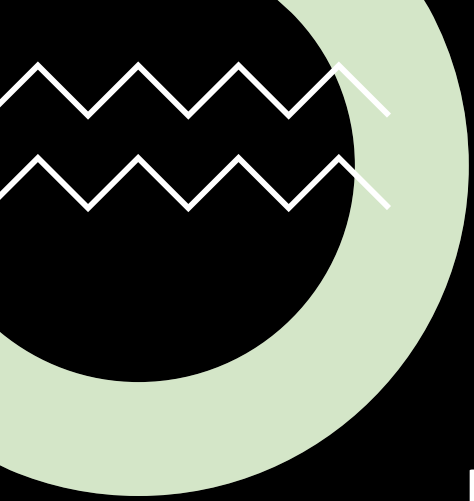

Let another man praise thee, and not thine own mouth; a stranger, and not thine own lips. (Prov. 27:2 KJV)


